1. Creating a MyScouting Account:

In order to file a tour permit on line, you must first create an account on MyScouting.org (<https://myscouting.scouting.org>) . It is a fairly simple process – click the link under “New To MyScouting” and following the instructions

New Training Courses
This is Scouting - provides an overview of the Scouting movement, including history, values, programs, youth protection, community involvement, training, and so on. The module consists of six video sections, each followed by a brief quiz. Completion is noted automatically in the BSA training records database if the module is experienced online. Estimated time to complete: 50 minutes.

Trek Safely - covers 7 key safety points about trekking, and is recommended for adult leaders organizing any type of trek. You will watch a brief video broken into two sections, answering questions after each section. Completion is noted automatically in the BSA training records database if the module is experienced online. Estimated time to complete: 20 minutes.

Climb on Safely - covers 8 key safety points about climbing and rappelling, and is recommended for adult leaders organizing any type of climbing outing. You will watch a brief video broken into three sections, answering questions after each section. Completion is noted automatically in the BSA training records database if the module is experienced online. Estimated time to complete: 30 minutes.

Under the General Tab, you will find the training that all Leaders are required to complete, as well as Supplemental training common to all leaders for certain activities (swimming, hiking, etc.).

- This is Scouting (formerly called New Leader Essentials) and Youth Protection is **required** for all Pack Leaders. Youth Protection must be renewed every two years. It is HIGHLY recommended that the first time you take Youth Protection that it is done in a classroom ... renewed on-line
- Leaders conducting any outdoor camping or hiking activities are **required** to complete Trek Safely and Weather Hazards training. In addition, Leaders conducting a camping trip are **required** to complete BALOO (Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation) training. This course is not available on-line (usually is done as an all day or overnight event). Webelos Leaders conducting a campout for their den are **required** to complete Webelos Outdoor Leader Training (again not available on-line).
- All outdoor events should have **at least One** appropriately trained leader (not all those attending need BALOO or Outdoor Leader training).
- Any event that is focused on a water event (swimming) or has the potential for access/interaction with water should have a leader who has completed Safe Swim Defense ... even if the focus of the event is not swimming. Examples: pools events, beach events, hikes that cross a stream.
