The Easy Guide to BSA E-Learning

1. Creating a MyScouting Account:

In order to file a tour permit on line, you must first create an account on MyScouting.org (https://myscouting.scouting.org). It is a fairly simple process – click the link under "New To MySCouting" and following the instructions



- 2. Once you have created an account Log on to MyScouting
- 3. On the Home Page, you should see a link to E-Learning on the left navigation bar (see circled link below). Click that Link




4. The E-Learning Page is fairly simple. Pack Leaders can access relevant course materials under both the "Cub Scout" tab and "General" tab.



For each course, you can Take a Course, Retake a Course (Youth Protection every 2 years) Review a Course and View Certificates of completion.

Under The Cub Scout tab you will find "role specific" training: Cubmaster, Tiger Leader, Den Leader, Webelos Leader, Committee Member. Depending on the role(s) you have in the Pack, your should complete the relevant courses. The Wolf/Bear Course need only be completed once ... not as a Wolf and a Bear Leader.



Under the General Tab, you will find the training that all Leaders are required to complete, as well as Supplemental training common to all leaders for certain activities (swimming, hiking, etc.).

- This is Scouting (formerly called New Leader Essentials) and Youth Protection is <u>required</u> for all Pack Leaders. Youth Protection must be renewed every two years. It is HIGHLY recommended that the first time you take Youth Protection that it is done in a classroom ... renewed on-line
- Leaders conducting any outdoor camping or hiking activities are <u>required</u> to complete Trek Safely
 and Weather Hazards training. In addition, Leaders conducting a camping trip are <u>required</u> to
 complete BALOO (<u>Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation</u>) training. This course is not available online (usually is done as an all day or overnight event). Webelos Leaders conducting a campout for
 their den are <u>required</u> to complete Webelos Outdoor Leader Training (again not available on-line).
- All outdoor events should have <u>at least One</u> appropriately trained leader (not all those attending need BALOO or Outdoor Leader training).
- Any event that is focused on a water event (swimming) or has the potential for access/interaction
 with water should have a leader who has completed Safe Swim Defense ... even if the focus of the
 event is not swimming. Examples: pools events, beach events, hikes that cross a stream.
