Scouts shall notify their Scoutmaster for approval of each Merit Badge they would like to start or complete at the Midway. All Scouts shall register through the Merit Badge Counselor prior to the Midway to complete any prerequisites for each Merit Badge attempted.

A Scoutmaster signed *Blue Card* is required for each Merit Badge course. Each Scout needs to bring the *Merit Badge worksheet*, and something to write with. Many times it is necessary to have most of the work complete depending on the MB. Scouts are **EXPECTED** to wear the Class 'A' uniform throughout the Midway. As a Troop fundraiser, beverages and snacks will be available for purchase. Lunch will be served from 11:30am to 2:30pm.

Merit Badge Midway Prerequisites:

+American Business - Entrepreneurship - Personal Management

*These three Merit Badges will be taught together during Session 7. To receive full credit for the three merit badges, pre & post-requisites must be completed. Please contact the Merit Badge Counselor prior to the Midway. Please see page 3 and 4 of this document for a full explanation for this course.

+Art

To receive full credit for Art, you will need to contact the counselor prior to the Midway for direction.

+American Heritage

To receive full credit for American Heritage, please complete #1, 3C, 4E - would recommend the "Main St. Walk of Fame" in Newhall, or 4B prior to the Midway then follow-up with the counselor after the Midway

+American Labor

To receive full credit for American Labor, please complete #2, 5, 7 and 9 prior to the Midway or follow-up with the counselor after the Midway

+Citizenship in the Community

To receive full credit for Citizenship in the Community; you will need to complete the following prior to Midway. 1. Write out what it means to be a citizen in your community. 2a. Make the map. 3. Attend one of the requested meetings. 4a. Complete this requirement. 4b. Complete this requirement. 5. Complete this requirement. Stop - Do not go any further.

+Citizenship in the Nation

To receive full credit for Citizenship in the Nation, please complete #2, 3, 6 and 8 prior to the Midway or follow-up with the counselor after the Midway. Reading the biography is not mandatory.

+Citizenship in the World

To receive full credit for Citizenship in the World, please complete #4 and 7 prior to the Midway or follow-up with the counselor after the Midway. Reading the biography is not mandatory.

+Chess

To receive full credit for Chess, please bring a chess board, chess pieces and a filled out 7 page questionnaire found online, also complete the 4 pages of requirements prior to Midway or follow-up with the counselor after the Midway.

+Digital Technology

To receive full credit for Digital Technology, you will need to contact the counselor prior to the Midway for direction. This will be a signoff opportunity only.

+Energy

To receive full credit for Energy MB, prior to the Midway study the requirements, the booklet, and other books and websites. Be prepared to discuss all the topics in requirements 2a & b, 3a, b, c, & d. Actually do the following requirements: 1a, 4a & b, 5a & b, 6a, b, c, d, e, 7, and 8 and write up the results of each activity, being prepared to explain them to me. This is a lot of reading and writing, so don't put it off very long. We will do some of the experiments and demonstrations in class. When using the internet, do so with your parents supervision and using safe internet research methods. In your preparation you should learn enough to understand the various topics and discuss them intelligently.

+Environmental Science

To receive full credit for Environmental Science, please print the Merit Badge requirements, and complete as many requirements as possible prior to the start of Midway. Many of the requirements require time and thought. Please contact the counselor prior to the Midway for direction.

+Family Life

To receive full credit for Family Life; you will need to complete the following prior to Midway. 1. Do all. 2. Do all, you will need to call me. 3. You will need to discuss this with your parents, than call me. Do not start your chores until we talk. After we talk, you may work on the chores. Not until we talk! 4. Answer how this will benefit your family. 5. We will discuss. Call me. 6a. Only; We will talk at the Midway about the rest of this Merit Badge.

+Fingerprinting

To receive full credit for Fingerprinting; please complete requirement; (1), (2) & (3). These must be done prior to the Midway, Requirements (4) & (5) will be done at the Midway. You also need to "Be Prepared" to discuss requirements (1), (2) & (3).

+Fire Safety

To receive full credit for Fire Safety, please complete the following pre-requisites: 6 all, 7 all, 9 all, 10 all, and 11 prior to the Midway or follow-up with the counselor after the Midway

+First Aid

The first 10 scouts that call the counselor will be registered for this class. Any additional will be placed on a wait list. To receive full credit for First Aid Merit Badge, please complete the following: 1. Call the counselor to receive a teaching assignment and be prepared to teach at the Midway; 2. Bring a well-stocked family first aid kit and know how to use everything in the kit; 3. Bring the First Aid MB printed worksheets; 4. Bring something to write with; 5. Bring a signed Blue-Card; Bring your Boy Scout Hand Book and First Aid MB book; You will need to follow-up with the counselor after the Midway.

+Genealogy

To receive full credit for Genealogy, you will need to contact the counselor prior to the Midway for direction.

+Geocaching

To receive full credit for Geocaching, you will need to contact the counselor prior to the Midway for direction.

+Graphic Arts

To receive full credit for Graphic Arts, you will need to contact the counselor prior to the Midway for direction. This will be a signoff opportunity only.

+Home Repairs

Bring eye protection

+Indian Lore

To receive full credit for Indian Lore, please print the Merit Badge requirements, and complete as many requirements as possible prior to the start of Midway. Many of the requirements require time and thought.

Insect Study

To receive full credit for Insect Study, please print the Merit Badge requirements, and complete requirements #5, #9, #10 and #13 prior to the start of Midway. Please purchase a Butterfly metamorphosis kit online and bring it to the Midway. Please contact the counselor prior to the Midway for direction.

+Inventing

To receive full credit for Inventing MB, prior to the Midway study the requirements, the booklet, and other books and websites. Be prepared to discuss all the topics in requirements 1a, 2b, 3a, b, & d, 4, & 9. Actually do the following requirements: 1b, 3c, 5, 6, 7, and 8. Inventing is a fun but intensive merit badge and you will have to actually invent an original device and build and test it, so don't put this off very long. When using the internet, do so with your parents supervision and using safe internet research methods. In your preparation you should learn enough to understand the various topics and discuss them intelligently.

+Leather Working

To receive full credit for Leather Working, please print the Merit Badge requirements, and complete as many requirements as possible prior to the start of Midway. Many of the requirements require time and thought.

+Robotics

To receive full credit for Robotics, you will need to contact the counselor prior to the Midway for direction. This will be a signoff opportunity only.

+Scholarship

To receive full credit for Scholarship, please complete #1A, bring in a report card, 2A for example, a library, CA Science Museum, or any museum in your area. 2C - bring in your daily planner. 3 - need a note from a principal, or school official, maybe an assistant principal. 4A or 4B, and 5A. Contact the Merit Badge Counselor to discuss the prerequisites prior to Midway.

+Scuba Diving

To receive full credit for Scuba Diving, please complete requirements #2 & #4 prior to Midway. If this is not possible, you will need to follow-up with the counselor after the Midway to complete requirement #4.

+Traffic Safety

To receive full credit for Traffic Safety, please read the entire Traffic Safety hand book.

Business Merit Badge Blitz

American Business – Entrepreneurship – Personal Management

Business meets Boy Scouts, in this accelerated merit badge session. There are overlapping topics in these three merit badges with relation to business concepts, money management, capital acquisition, and economic principals.

This class will cover the educational aspects of these merit badges. The topics can be intense and the attendees should already have reviewed the requirements and prepared in advance. In addition, the depth of the topic will require note taking and a willingness to learn and apply the provided information to various financial and organizational situations.

In order to earn all three-merit badges, certain prerequisites must be met. The merit badge worksheets and pamphlets should be referenced for the specifics of each requirement. The following lists of action items are the requirements that involve individual effort outside the scope of the class. The requirements have been listed in a table to show the comparisons and overlap of the action items within each merit badge.

Broad questions, concerns, or confusion should be addressed prior to class since the allotted time will be limited.
